“Done”



Last summer I was listening to the radio and a country song came on called “Done.” I was very intrigued by the song’s concept. It is a love story that the author wrote for his wife about when he met her, he was “done”. But there is a secondary meaning to this song. Listen to some of these lyrics.

“Done, All the Hell I was raising, Done!
Done, All the careless heartbreaking, Done!
Done, for the chance that you’re taking,
I spent my nights praying and all my days chasing...
Done!”

I began to think about all those people in Jesus’ day who were singing the same song by their lifestyle. They were chasing something and never finding it. But after meeting Jesus, they were changed. They found what they were seeking. Their lives were never the same.

They were really similar to people of today. People searching for love, acceptance, health, peace, respect, or friendship. Regardless of what is missing, there is an emptiness in their soul. The things they have tried in life have not worked out and didn’t fill that empty spot. They are at a crossroads with trying, living, dreaming. They don’t realize it, but what they are really looking for is a personal relationship with Jesus.

In New Testament times Jesus was right there physically; but today Jesus isn’t living on the earth. That is where we come in. We are the words, hands, and feet of Jesus. There are people all around us who are lost, still seeking something and what they’ve tried ... hasn’t worked. They are saying, “I’m done with this lifestyle, with sin, with following the crowd, with doubt, with shame, and with death.”

This Easter season you will have the opportunity to reach out to people (coworkers, neighbors, school contacts, relatives) who are just like the woman at the well, the paralytic man, the woman caught in adultery, Peter, John the Baptist, or a sinful woman. They are looking for exactly what Jesus offers. They gladly would say, “I’m done” and follow Jesus. May God give us this opportunity.
