
LifeGroup Sermon Series Study 2021-2022 Series Six







By the time this is published, my daughter Kati and her husband Brian will have had their beautiful daughter. It has been interesting watching them try to figure out a name for their child.

Sometimes naming children can be very difficult. Husbands, wives, parents, and friends seem to always have an opinion. Naming children is a lot different today

than in Bible times. Today we usually name our children based on what sounds good, what is popular, or a good memory of a particular name.

In Bible times naming someone was much more significant. Names were chosen based on what they meant. Every name reflected a purpose, or a future hope, or a character quality. For example, Abram which means "exalted father," was changed to Abraham which means "father of a multitude." Jacob means "grabber of the heel" and "deceitful." The biblical Jacob also received the name "Israel" (after wrestling with God) which means "one who prevails." In the New Testament, Simon's name was changed to Peter which means "rock."

In English we only have a few names for God - God, Lord, Jesus, the Holy Spirit. But in Hebrew we find in the Old Testament many names for God; and each name has a significant meaning describing a quality of God.

In this series we are going to look at six names that reflect some very significant qualities of God. We can spend the rest of our lives trying to discover who God is; but by simply looking at the names given to God we will effectively be progressing in our search.

I am looking forward to learning together in this series as we seek to know God better by studying His name.
