## **Pastor's Point:**

**September 2014**

### **"Iron Sharpens Iron"**

As I reflect on the last 10 years of LifeWater's history and how God blended two congregations together into one, I am still truly amazed. I am amazed at the story of how Liberty Hills Baptist Church was started, how it grew, and how God put this church in the perfect place at the perfect time to connect with LifeWater Community Church. I am amazed at how God convinced me to start LifeWater through the encouragement of a trusted friend, Bill Armstrong. I am amazed at how LifeWater grew and how God put this church in the perfect place at the perfect time to connect with Liberty Hills. I am also amazed at how smoothly the transition took place; how we gelled into one congregation so easily. I am amazed at everything we have seen happen at LWCC: the growth, the salvations, the miracles, the healings, the ministry, and the expansion.

As I reflect over the last 10 years our world and our country have changed a lot: wars, murders, violence, hurricanes, tornadoes, floods, persecution of Christians, our country turning away from God, lack of morality and absolutes, Americans turning away from the church, and our culture spinning out of control. Life is continuing to change and move ahead. As I see our world escalating toward chaos it makes me wonder what role the church will have in the next 10 years. What does God have for us to do? Who does God want us to be? Where does God want us to go? As I think about these questions and many more, I know we are living in days like we have never seen before. I can't help but wonder what God has for LWCC.

As I meditate on this question and ask God repeatedly what He has in store for us, one very loud message has consistently come back to me: "Prepare My People." I believe that many Christians have either fallen asleep or they are not at their post and alert. The Christian walk is hard. It takes work. It takes focus. It takes energy. For the next 10 months we are going to "Prepare My People" through five series: *Thirst, The Call, Thrive, Impact, and Heroes*. These series focus on five areas that are essential for you to grow in as a follower of Christ. In addition to this we are going to use our small groups, now called "Life Groups," to further apply the truth that has been taught and encourage each other through accountability. This will help us to move further in our transformation as we connect with other people to pray, encourage each other, and help us grow. Proverbs 27:17 says, "As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another."

My goal is that by May of 2015 we will have a group of Christ-followers who are solid in their faith and are disciple-makers impacting the world around them. If persecution comes, then this group will be prepared for it and the Holy Spirit will use them in a mighty way. I have a very high goal: I am praying that 90% of our church participates in our "Life Groups." Will you please consider getting involved in a Life Group? It will change your life for eternity.

In this series we are considering some of the ways the above statement is accomplished. This month, we'll consider the need for being in a community to grow as believers in Christ.

We are conformed to the image of Christ incrementally over time in the context of disciplines and practices that open us to God's work in us. This happens with others as we help each other take that next step with Jesus. Paul's teaching on spiritual transformation (in Romans 12 and in the other epistles) is always given in the context of community—the body of Christ with its many members. We are given to one another in the body of Christ for mutual edification and to spur one another on to love and good deeds. Our spiritual gifts are given, not primarily for our own benefit or self-aggrandizement, but so we can be agents of grace for one another, building up the Body of which we are only one part.

As Robert Mulholland writes, "We can no more be conformed to the image of Christ outside corporate spirituality than a coal can continue to burn outside of the fire." (*Invitation to a Journey*, p.145) While our spiritual practices certainly include private disciplines (solitude and silence, prayer and meditation, scripture, self-examination and confession, retreat, discernment), to be effective, our practices must also include disciplines in community (corporate prayer and worship, teaching, communion, Sabbath, hospitality, caring for those in need, spiritual friendship and direction), and disciplines of engagement with the world (evangelism, caring for the poor, compassion, justice, etc.).

Commitment to one another in a community is essential for real change to take place. You and I are all aware of people who suddenly leave the church. They become involved and develop close and often intimate relationships with others; very often it is with the pastor or one of the leaders who is journeying with them in their lives. Then God reveals something that requires change—maybe an addiction, a habit, a sin, a confrontation, an offense...the list is endless and ranges from minor to major issues. What is often their response? Leave the body of believers and go somewhere else where they can hide and not face the pain of change. Thus they avoid the work that God wants to do in them to bring them healing and make them more like Christ.

Beloved, this issue is epidemic in the church, in relationships, in marriages, in jobs, etc. When we don't like the situation which God wants to use to change us into Jesus' image, we leave the situation. We take the junk with us and never get beyond it.

A follower of Christ is committed to a body of believers and lets them into his or her world. Together they resolve the issues that (will) arise. Please don't run away from them because your brothers and sisters are God's gift to you to help you take that next step with Jesus. He designed it that way!

**Charis Corner: Stories of Grace in a Broken World**

Waiting. It is one of the hardest things for someone with control issues to do—at least do well. It’s especially hard for me, knowing there is nothing I can do. I am completely powerless, and that scares me.

I had planned on writing this piece about my friend, who followed God’s call into full time missions and provide her needed funds a day before her final due date. That waiting had to have been excruciating.

But that’s not the story God called me to write today. I’m going to tell you my story.

New Years Day of 2014 brought about a new year for me. I had my first agent rejection with no deadline on the horizon. I worked with my brother’s stellar wife to finish editing my novel—then only 48,000 words. I wasn’t sure where God was going to lead me next, so I did a bit of wandering in the “wasteland” stage of my life.

Two months later, I was ready to submit my novel—or so I thought. My novel was now a bit longer, a bit tighter, so I entered an online contest, where I—no surprise here—didn’t make it. But this step was crucial. Here I learned that fantasy novels (with magic and made-up worlds) needed to be at least 70,000 words. I had to start over and rewrite the whole thing (add to my “bare bones” of a story).

Here’s where most people give up. It’s too much work. Maybe I’m not cut out for this. But I didn’t respond this way. This was my dream, and I refused to give up. I worked until the end of June. It ended up being 88,000 words—almost double what I had had in December.

Which leads me up to July—the month I had planned to start querying. I had no critique partner. I had a frustrating beginning that needed tweaked. I had a query to rewrite. And I had pressure coming from everywhere—myself, my husband, my kids, friends, family, etc.

Then something amazing happened. I gave it all to God. I spent a lot of time in prayer and solitude. I took my career one day at a time. And God came through. On August 1<sup>st</sup>, I sent out my queries. The next day—a Saturday—an amazing agent emailed me. She was in love with my premise and wanted to read the whole novel. She assured me I would hear from her within 60 days.

And now I’m waiting. The old me would be stalking my email and Twitter. But now I’m resting while I wait. I am working on an adult novel, which takes place in Savannah during the Great Depression and WWII. I’m working at our daycare and subbing, as well as being a mom. But I’m living one day at a time, content with my life today. I’m trusting God with my dream and not worrying...for the first time. I still wrestle with fear and uncertainty. But I look back over the past eight months and see God’s hand on my life, and I know I can trust him with whatever tomorrow brings.

## Children's Ministry and Kids Crossing Daycare Update

**Preschool is starting again at Kids Crossing!** The 4-5 year old class will be held on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 12:30 p.m.-3:00 p.m. beginning September 3rd. We will review letters, numbers, colors, and shapes, and introduce phonics and word recognition along with early math concepts. We will sing songs, learn Bible verses, have story time, and work on learning basic calendar and weather concepts. There will be pencil to paper work, but we will also be learning through play, arts/crafts, and science, as well as working on interpersonal skills. The cost for the three-day class is \$135/month; the cost for the two-day class is \$110/month. Tuition is due the first school day of each month starting in September. The school year will run from September through May with days off for holidays, Christmas break, spring break, etc. If we have enough interest, a 2-3 year old class may be added at a later date.



**Children's Workers Needed:** Now that the new school year has begun and schedules become more consistent, I look forward to more regular attendance in Sunday School. It is important for your children (and YOU) to be at church each week! With more regular attendance, we will be in need of more teachers. The greatest need is for teachers in the 1-2 year old room and in the 1st-5th grade. With the growth of that class and the larger range of ages, it may become desirable to split the 3rd-5th grade into their own class. However, this cannot be done without additional adult volunteers who will commit to teaching this oldest age group. Please see me (Tracey) if you can teach.
