Styles for Total Impact



Our world today needs answers. We need hope. We need love. We need acceptance. In the last two days (as I write this) we have seen one suicide and one murdersuicide in Fort Wayne. That is not even mentioning the murders, suicides, shootings, and attacks that are happening in our nation daily. If there was ever a time that we needed a savior, it is now; and I believe Jesus Christ is that savior.

We use a term at LifeWater called "Person of Interest." This is a person you know that is not actively walking with Jesus and/or not attending church. The person can be a hardened atheist, or a seeker, a person who once accepted Christ but has not grown in faith, or a person who has walked away from their faith and/or church. The Person of Interest can be a co-worker, friend, neighbor, someone who sits next to you in school, a family member, a child, youth, or adult. It is someone who you know and interact with (or have the potential to interact with) on a regular basis.

Studies show that followers of Christ are fearful of transitioning conversations to spiritual things, sharing our story of faith, and inviting people to church. But studies also show that non-Christians are very open to spiritual conversations, hearing our story, and accepting an invitation to church. People who are not walking with Jesus want two things: A personal relationship and authenticity. People are not projects; programs are not more important than people; and we need to authentically love others.

This series is about how you and I, average followers of Christ who are learning and growing in our faith, can have a total impact on the world around us. We don't need to be a pastor, evangelist, or have a dynamic testimony. We simply need to care about people who are lost, be intentional, and allow God to lead us. I am looking forward to learning together how to totally impact our world.
