Pastor's Point:

November 2015

“The Harvest is Plentiful”

“The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field. . . .” (Luke 10:2)

Recently my wife and I went camping down in Turkey Run State Park. Yes, in 35 degree weather we went camping. That is another story. On our ride down and back we saw the harvest taking place. Combine after combine were out in the field harvesting the soybeans and corn. I was amazed at how quick and effective these farmers were in harvesting their crops. As we were driving home I noticed one field. It had one row picked but that was it. All the fields around this one had been harvested. I wondered what was wrong until I drove by the combine that was in the field. It had a flat tire. Because of that flat tire the farmer couldn't harvest his crops. He had to wait until a mechanic could come out and fix the tire.

What an unfortunate picture of the church sometimes. Unfaithful leadership, people who refuse to be led, money issues, grumbling, disunity, confusion, pride, selfishness, busyness, sin — you name it — represents the flat tire. The church can't focus on the harvest because there is so much fighting on the inside. How thankful I am that the tires on our “combine” are not flat.

If you haven't noticed yet we are having a revival at LifeWater. The Holy Spirit has been moving and people have been listening and obeying. People have been committing to following Jesus for the first time. Children's workers have been answering the call and volunteering for the Sunday and Wednesday night children's programs. People are growing in their faith and taking the next step in following Jesus. Fourteen out of the last 15 weeks our giving has been \$2,159.00 or more. We have three people who have been Christians for a long time who are now having the opportunity to follow up on our new followers of Christ. Disciples making disciples is beginning to happen. Do you know why this is happening? It's not because we have such great programs. It's because people are being obedient and answering the call that God has placed on their lives. God is moving and He is asking you to take the next step, whatever that might be in your life. Will you answer His call on your life?


There will be a Life Group coaches' meeting in the café on November 8th following the morning service.

Charis Corner: Stories of Grace in a Broken World

TENACITY

I've procrastinated writing this piece. I've questioned the timing, my readiness, and my ability to word it properly, but I'm burning with excitement to share what God's done in my heart.

All my life I've struggled with control. I want everyone (especially God) to do exactly what I want, when I want, because I know best. (My family would describe these tendencies as "bossy," as I've been since I was a child). However, in the past year and a half, I've made some radical changes. I stopped working fulltime and poured my heart into a new dream—writing novels. And finally, I stopped panicking and started trusting. By focusing on only today, the anxiety of tomorrow and finances dissolved. I clung to the last clear word I had from God: stay with your husband, pour your heart into your novels, and smother your children with love.

I wrote an earlier article about [The Dream Giver](#). I believed once I went through the different steps of this path, I'd have everything I wanted. (Ha!) Instead, I struggled through wastelands and collapsed near dried-up rivers, grieving over how thirsty and exhausted I was. What this adventure—mind-crippling, will-draining, disheartening experience—taught me was faith. It starts so small. But it grows; as long as you continue to water it with God's truth and prune away the pieces that need to be cut.

In December/January, this meant for me to put away my first novel, the male Cinderella story. I went away for my anniversary and asked God to take over my writing career. So He did. I got three new ideas for novels, and the first gripped not only me but my husband (and believe me, that rarely happens). So I continued entering novel one in contests, looking for feedback, and dreaming about novel two. In March, I hit a rock wall in novel two. I couldn't go any further until I did something I'd never tried—plot my novel.

When April came, I made a difficult decision. I set aside novel two and dusted off beloved novel one. After an ugly cry, I cut off the first quarter of the novel (about 80 pages) and started over. I plotted and spent the month rewriting. Then I sent off my new pages to my writing friends and dove into plotting novel two. I didn't worry about never getting published, and not being good enough. I wrote what I needed to each day.

Feedback began trickling in. They LOVED the changes. I was finally on the right track. For three or four months I did nothing but edit my novel, with my friends' feedback and my own. Then in September, I began querying again and drafting novel two, which is why I took the month off of writing Charis Corner.

Today, I have three agents who are reading my entire manuscript ("full request") and one who is reading the first five chapters ("partial request"). Novel two has exploded from a dual (two person) point of view novel into having four points of view, one of which is the villain's. I'm weaving the Holy Spirit and its impact on my life into novel two (novel one focuses on forgiveness), and I'm telling my writer friends I'm praying for them and sharing my struggles and joys. They in turn have invested their personal lives in me. So no matter what happens, I'm His light in this very dark world. And I refuse to give up.

Operation Christmas Child (a ministry of Samaritan's Purse)

Church, we are at the end of our collection season with just a couple of weeks until we gather together to pack our shoeboxes!! The LWCC packing party will be held **Friday, November 13th at 6:15 p.m.** We will start with a spaghetti dinner and then have a blast as we pack our shoeboxes. This ministry is having a huge global impact. Shoeboxes are distributed to over 100 countries and the gospel is shared with as many of the recipients as possible. Their parents are encouraged to get involved and even if they don't directly, they do see the impact it has on their children. Here is a measure of the impact: one child every 30 seconds, on average, throughout 2015 will accept Jesus as their Lord and Savior due to this ministry! That is a bit over one MILLION new brothers and sisters in Christ. These will be the leaders of tomorrow throughout the world.

During each Sunday service for the next several weeks we will communicate which items are most needed to complete our shoeboxes. With God's Holy Spirit guiding each of us we will get as many shoeboxes completed as He wants.

One huge item that God has impressed on my heart to include in every shoebox is a personal letter. These can be as the Lord leads you. Content could include: God loves them, your name (and address in case they want to write you), a photo of your family, and any other encouragement! Here is a sample letter, but just an idea:

*Hello,
We love Jesus and know that He loves you, too! We packed this shoebox just for you with the help of God's Holy Spirit. God knew you would receive this box before we put it together. Isn't that cool! We have prayed for you and hope you will know the love of the Father in your life. You are special to Him. Our names are Rich and Patti Quintano. If you wish to, you can write us at 13218 Timbercrest Trail, Fort Wayne, IN 46814 USA.*

During November we are also collecting candy to put in the shoeboxes. Appropriate items include hard candy, candy corn, gummy bears, caramels, taffy, gum, Smarties, Starburst and Tootsie Roll Midgees. You may not include Hershey Kisses, Snickers bars, or any other chocolate, fruit roll-ups, fruit snacks, or drink mixes such as Kool-Aid due to customs regulations.
